Conditions of Entry

3. Every exhibit must be the work of the exhibitor.
4. The exhibit must not have been entered in a previous Lithgow Show.
5. The work must have been completed in the last 12 months prior to the show.
6. Must be clean, NOT worn, NOT washed.
7. Duplicate tickets must be produced before articles will be given out.
8. No competitor to be present while judging is taking place.
9. The judges are empowered to reject work that in their opinion has been shown previously and continuously.
10. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

All Prize money must be collected from the treasurer on the Sunday after the show. No prize money under \$30.00 will be posted.
